While we believe that the Bible reserves the role of ordained pastoral ministry for men, we also believe that God calls women to minister in his church and Kingdom in vitally important ways. We welcome and encourage women students in all our degree programs, and we offer a variety of other activities for women students, as well as generous scholarship support specifically for women.

Whether you're just beginning to explore where God may be calling you to serve, are already involved in ministry and looking to sharpen your skills, or simply want to deepen your personal understanding of the Scriptures, Covenant Seminary has an educational option that fits your needs. Most of our degrees are offered with online and/or hybrid-learning options for greater accessibility and flexibility.

+ MASTER OF DIVINITY (MDIV)

99 credit hours Offered residentially or in hybrid format (requiring only 6 visits to campus).

Though designed as the primary degree for training ordained pastors or ministry leaders, the MDiv offers a Specialized Track for women or men not seeking to serve in ordained ministry. The MDiv equips ministry leaders to communicate the truths of Scripture, understand themselves and others through a biblical worldview, and develop a deeper love for Christ so that they are equipped to lead and serve his church.

+ MASTER OF ARTS IN COUNSELING (MAC)

75 credit hours Offered residentially only.

Our clinically focused, biblically grounded MAC program will help you become a biblically faithful and clinically excellent counselor. We help you harmonize contemporary counseling theories and techniques with a Christian worldview, and when you graduate you are prepared for licensure, changed by a community of grace, and ready to help hurting people.

+ MASTER OF ARTS (BIBLICAL & THEOLOGICAL STUDIES) (MABTS)

66 credit hours

Offered residentially, fully online, or in hybrid format.

The MABTS is a deeply biblical degree that offers study of one or both biblical languages alongside Bible and theology classes. It is ideal for ministry leaders, Bible and theology teachers, or those who wish to pursue a PhD. The MABTS offers concentrations in church planting or Greek and Hebrew, with an option for doing a thesis.

+ MASTER OF ARTS IN MINISTRY (MAM)

54 credit hours Offered residentially or in hybrid format (with as few as 4 visits to campus).

The MAM is a customizable degree that provides ministry training to fit your specific calling. Pursue it via the MAM General Track or choose from four different areas of concentrated study (biblical studies and Christian ministry, counseling ministries, cultural apologetics and communication, or educational ministries) aimed at equipping ministry leaders with biblical training and practical leadership skills.

+ MASTER OF ARTS (THEOLOGICAL STUDIES) MATS

54 credit hours

Offered residentially, fully online, or in hybrid format.

The MATS is a graduate-level theology degree that is ideal for ministry leaders, lay leaders, church elders, or Bible and theology teachers. Its major benefit over other degrees is its format accessibility and its open-ended nature, allowing students to pursue to the direction of their choice.

+ MASTER OF ARTS IN MISSIONAL THEOLOGY (MAMT)

48 credit hours

Offered residentially only through our Missional Training Center–Phoenix location.

The MAMT is designed to equip ministry leaders already serving in the American Southwest. Learn from and alongside other active church leaders as courses in biblical studies, church history, and theology are applied with relevance to the local church as you participate in ministry.

+ DOCTOR OF MINISTRY (DMIN)

30 credit hours

Offered residentially or in hybrid format.

The DMin is designed to sustain pastors and other ministry leaders for the challenges of ministry. Learn with and from leaders in ministry and become better equipped and sustained for long-term ministry. Has a dissertation component that helps you dive deeply into a practical area of ministry relevant to your current context.

+ MASTER OF THEOLOGY (THM)

30 credit hours

Offered residentially or in hybrid format.

The ThM is an advanced degree for students holding an MDiv that gives them the opportunity for directed study for the purpose of preparing to pursue a PhD, to wrestle with doctrines or issues of faith, or to hone ministry skills. You may pursue the degree either in residence or via a modular track comprised of intensive courses on campus, and advisor-guided research and independent study.

+ GRADUATE CERTIFICATE (GC)

8–20 credit hours Offered residentially or fully online.

The flexibly structured GC is designed to equip lay leaders in the Bible, theology, and ministry, and can be ideal for those who do not need a full theology degree but want to learn from world-class seminary faculty about topics beneficial for their Christian growth and ministry—such as ruling elders, deacons, ministry staff, and lay leaders. Most classes taken are transferable to our other master's programs for students wanting further study.

FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS

We want to make seminary as affordable as possible. Every year we award \$1.8 million in scholarships to students to help cover the costs of their education. As part of this we offer some scholarships especially for women. This is an investment in your future ministry and the future health of the church.

+ WOMEN'S MINISTRY LEADERSHIP AWARD

This scholarship was established to help launch female students into ministry with little or no debt. This is a **full-tuition scholarship** given to a female MDiv student in her last year of study who is recognized via recommendations as having high potential for ministry leadership.

+ MINISTRY LEADERSHIP AWARDS

This **50%-tuition scholarship** is awarded to a limited number of full-time, on-campus MDiv students based on character, calling, gifting, need, and demonstrated ministry experience.

+ SPOUSE TEAMWORK AWARDS

Because Covenant Seminary believes that Christian ministry involves the whole family, we provide qualified spouses of all full-time students with the opportunity to attend courses. Spouses may audit courses for free or take courses for credit with the following scholarships:

- A 100%-tuition Scholarship for student spouses pursuing the MAM, MATS, MDiv, MABTS, or GC.
- A 67%-tuition Scholarship for student spouses pursuing the MAC.

Spouses must complete all normal seminary admission requirements. The scholarship is for tuition only; spouses must pay for their fees and books, and for any tuition not covered by the scholarship.

The goal of a seminary education is to not only know the Bible, but to be transformed through a deeper relationship with Christ. We believe the deepest transformation occurs within community. Many of our alumni point to their time in the living, learning, and worshiping gospel-centered community at Covenant as one of the greatest times of their life. Our Student Life team works to cultivate this transformation in a number of ways.

Weekly Chapel Services

Every Friday morning we gather as a community to worship God and share fellowship with one another. Services are usually planned and led by Covenant students, with faculty members and other guest speakers offering exhortation and encouragement from God's Word. Special activities like Day of Prayer also take place throughout each semester.

Whole-Person Support

Because relationships are the heart of the Christian life and the basis of effective ministry, our Student Life team intentionally pursues time with each student individually—whether man or woman, residential or online—to walk with you as you face the challenges and blessings of seminary life and learn how to minister well to others.

Personal Transformation through Cohort Groups

Growth occurs as we become more like Christ. This is crucial for leaders of Christ's church. Cohort groups are designed to promote sustainability for a lifetime of ministry by helping you grow in emotional and spiritual health, relational skills, and wise conflict resolution through reflection on your own story withing a safe group of your peers.

Gospel-Centered Community

Campus life is geared toward nurturing growth in gospelcentered community through many avenues that bring students, faculty, staff, and families together in creative, challenging, and life-changing ways.

- Our Family Nurture program offers occasional free childcare and opportunities for parents to enjoy time to themselves.
- Student groups and organizations based on specific interests abound, including the Women's Student Fellowship, International Women's Fellowship, Women of Wisdom (for women over 40), and the Ministry Spouse Foundations discussion series.
- We enjoy seminary-wide picnics where students, faculty and staff gather for food, fun, and fellowship.
- Other special programs, events, and activities also provide excellent opportunities for growth in grace together.

Robust Online/Hybrid Community

All our students are important to the life and health of the Covenant community, so we try hard to include our online and hybrid-learning students in as many ways as possible. In addition to online cohorts and class-related discussions, many campus activities and events are livestreamed or include an online component. Student Life's Online Care Coordinator keeps in touch with online students on a regular basis as well.
